<u>Criterion 2:</u> The site is an important breeding site for waterbirds, including some species on the Danish red list, e.g. Bittern (*Botaurus stellaris*) and White-tailed Eagle (*Haliaetus albicilla*).

<u>Criterion 6:</u> The site regularly supports more than 1% of the individuals in the populations of the following species (count data 1999):

Greylag Goose (Anser anser) 9,200 – 4,4% of the NW Europe/SW Europe population

Shoveler (*Anas clypeata*) 1,123 – 2,8% of the NW/Central Europe population

Pochard (*Aythya ferina*) 12,092 – 3,5% of the NW/NE Europe population

Tufted Duck (*Aythya fuligula*) 18,955 – 1,9% of the Northwestern Europe population

Smew (Mergus albellus) 264 – 1% of the NW/Central Europe population

South-Southeast of Maribo town, Lolland. Administrative region is Storstrøm County.

- 17. Noteworthy flora: (indicating, e.g., which species/communities are unique, rare, endangered or biogeographically important, etc) Several calcareous fens with orchid populations along the shores of the lakes. High conservation values of the wet natural forests along the shoreline of the lakes.
- 18. Noteworthy fauna: (indicating, e.g., which species are unique, rare, endangered, abundant or biogeographically important; include count data, etc.)

Regular locality for Smew (*Mergellus albellus*) and White-tailed Eagle (*Haliaetus albicilla*). Important breeding area for the Greylag goose (*Anser Anser*), Great Crested Grebe, and Marsh Harrior (*Circus aeruginosus*). One of the most important staging areas in Denmark for Tufted Duck (*Aythya fuligula*) and Pochard (*Aythya ferina*).

Important breeding area in eastern Denmark for Sandwich Tern (*Sterna sanvicinsis*) and waders, especially Black-tailed Godwit (*Limosa limosa*) and Ruff (*Philomachus pugnax*).

The site is a resting and feeding area for waterbirds (count data from 1999): Goosander (*Mergus merganser*) 464

Breeding area for aquatic and salt marsh birds including Cormorant (*Phalacrocorax carbo*), Bittern (*Botaurus stellaris*), Marsh Harrier (*Circus aeruginosus*), White-tailed Eagle (*Haliaetus albicilla*), Honey Buzzard (*Pernis apivorus*), and Common Tern (*Sterna hirundo*).

Private, the State represented by the Ministry of Environment and Storstrøm County.

The use of fertilisers on adjacent farmland has increased eutrophication of lakes, which, on the other hand, receive less non-purified sewage and waste water.

Potential threats are: Further eutrophication of the lakes. Discontinuation of grazing by cattle.

Disturbance by people engaged in leisure activities.

23. Conservation measures taken: (national category and legal status of protected areas - including any boundary changes which have been made: management practices; whether an officially approved management plan exists and whether it has been implemented)

Nature conservation: Lakeshore hinterlands, about 2,000 hectares.

Restoration of existing and former lake, Hejrede Lake (100 hectares), was initiated in 1993.

The whole area is identical with the EU Bird Protection Area No. 87. The whole area is identical with the EU Habitat Protection Site No. 156.

The lakes have been protected as a Wildlife reserve with hunting and sailing restrictions.

24. Conservation measures proposed but not yet implemented: (e.g. management plan in preparation; officially proposed as a protected area etc.)

The Storstrøm County and the Danish Forest and Nature Agency are planning a major restoration of former wetlands (100 hectares) and Lake Hejrede in the southeastern part of the Ramsar Site.

 Storstrøm County runs a nature school at Maribo Søndersø. A bird observation towers and a hide also exists. An information brochure has been published.
